GENERAL RULES & GUIDELINES

NOTE: See page 3 of this booklet for important dates and times (entry drop-off, prize money & entry pickup).

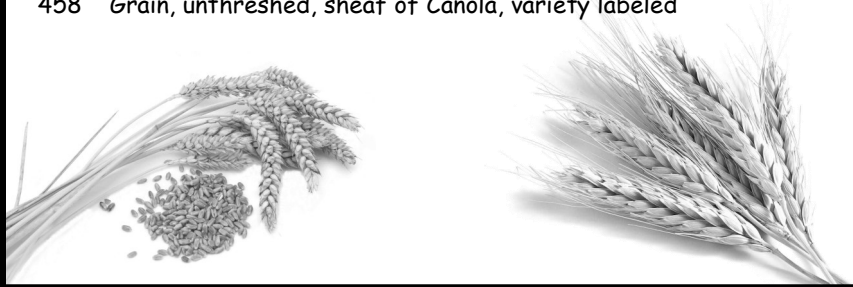
1. Hay should contain a high percentage of leaves. Stems should be free from excess moisture. It should have a bright green, fresh colour, fresh aroma and be free of mould and mustiness.
2. Sheaves of grain are not to be over 30 inches in length and should be stripped of leaves, tied with 3 bands and at least 3" in diameter at centre band. Colour of straw, size of head, quality and purity of variety, as well a makeup of sheaf will be considered in judging.
3. Both grass and legume silage should have a high leaf content, and a clean pleasant odor. The texture should be pliable and soft. A uniform length of cut is desirable.

GENERAL RULES & GUIDELINES

NOTE: See page 3 of this booklet for important dates and times (entry drop-off, prize money & entry pickup).

1. All food entries in this section become the property of Medicine Hat Exhibition and Stampede. Due to Health Regulations, all baking will be disposed of at the end of the show.
2. Out-of-town entries may be mailed to the Medicine Hat Exhibition and Stampede, Box 1298, Medicine Hat, AB T1A 7N1. Include entry fee with entries. We will not be responsible for returning the items.
3. No exhibitor may make more than one entry in any one class or they will be disqualified.
4. Any article that has been previously entered at the Medicine Hat Exhibition and Stampede will **NOT** be eligible for a prize.
5. In the absence of competition in any class, or if the items are of inferior quality, the judges shall exercise discretion as to whether they shall award 1st, 2nd or any prize.
6. On occasion, a miscellaneous class may be subdivided at the discretion of the convener and/or the judges if the number of entries warrant such action.
7. Only **ONE** 1st, 2nd or 3rd prize will be awarded in each class.
8. Exhibitors must fill out the entry form and tag. Once the entry is properly tagged, remove the claim check and retain. As claim checks are required for identification in claiming prize money, winners should claim their prize money **BEFORE** surrendering the check and reclaiming the entry.
NOTE: Entry tags are available in advance from the Stampede Office.
9. Security precautions are taken, but the Medicine Hat Exhibition and Stampede **WILL NOT** be responsible for loss or damage to entries.
10. Medicine Hat Exhibition and Stampede employees, conveners, judges and their immediate families (that is those residing under the same roof) are excluded from competition in their respective sections.
11. All people wishing to view their exhibits during Stampede Week are responsible for the gate admission.
12. All children & senior entries require the age on the entry tag and entry form.

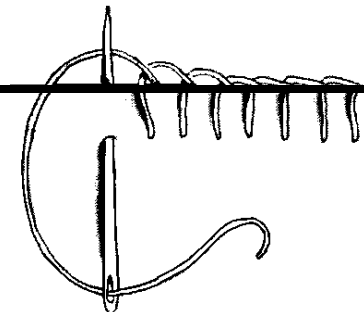

1. No person shall act as a judge in any class in which he or she is an exhibitor
2. Any exhibitor lodging a protest with regard to a judge's decision or a grievance in the fair, must be accompanied by a deposit of \$25. A protest may contain only **ONE** grievance and must plainly state the cause of the complaint or appeal. The same is to be forfeited in case the protest(s) is/are not sustained. An appeal or grievance will be investigated by a 3-member committee appointed by the President of the Medicine Hat Exhibition & Stampede. All protests must be made in writing prior to 6:00 p.m. on the final day of the exhibition and must be delivered to the General Manager.
3. The Medicine Hat Exhibition & Stampede will not be liable for any loss or accidents to exhibits, but strenuous efforts will be made for their safety.
4. No person, other than officers of the Fair, shall be allowed near the judge during the time of judging or in any manner interfere with the judges while on duty. Forfeiture of all prizes shall be the penalty for infraction of this rule.
5. In the absence of competition in any section or if the entry is of inferior quality, the judge shall exercise his/her discretion as to whether he/she shall award first, second or any placing.

7. All entries must be homemade or homegrown.
